"Hi, I'm Dr. Heller. I'm your pediatrician and am here to examine your baby." Dr. Dan was, without a doubt, the most unique, charismatic and outgoing individual who one will ever meet. As one mother remarked to me, "You will always remember the first time you met Dr. Dan."
