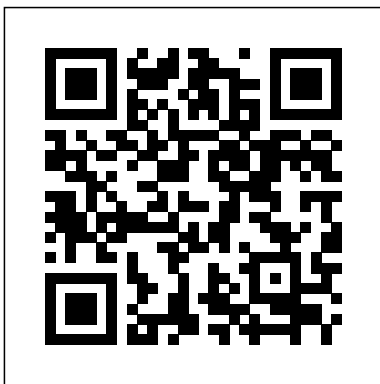

Yet he never wavers from his belief that inside the great, ongoing American experiment, progress is always possible.
