Big Dirty Money details the scandalously common and concrete ways that ordinary Americans suffer when the well-heeled use white collar crime to gain and sustain wealth, social status, and political influence. Profiteers caused the mortgage meltdown and the prescription opioid crisis, they've evaded taxes and deprived communities of public funds for education, public health, and infrastructure. Taub goes beyond the headlines (of which

there is no shortage) to track how we got here (essentially a post-Enron failure of prosecutorial muscle, the growth of "too big to jail" syndrome, and a developing implicit immunity of the upper class) and pose solutions that can help catch and convict offenders.

The commission led to some of the most far-reaching reforms in US history, as well as sensational hearings that led to the fall of the leading bankers and financiers of that era.

Why do the Heathen Rage? is a perplexity that presents a melting pot of the supernatural and the natural. Late Migrations: A Natural History of Love and Loss For the past four years, Margaret Renkl's

columns have offered readers of The New York Times a weekly dose of natural beauty, human

decency, and persistent hope from her home in Nashville. Now more than sixty of those pieces have

been brought together in this sparkling new collection. "People have often asked me how it feels to

be the 'voice of the South,' " writes Renkl in her introduction. "But I'm not the voice of the

South, and no one else is, either." There are many Souths—red and blue, rural and urban,

mountain and coast, Black and white and brown—and no one writer could possibly represent all of

them. In Graceland, At Last, Renkl writes instead from her own experience about the complexities of

her homeland, demonstrating along the way how much more there is to this tangled region than

many people understand. In a patchwork quilt of personal and reported essays, Renkl also highlights

some other voices of the South, people who are fighting for a better future for the region. A group of

find the generosity of spirit and deep attention to the world, human and nonhuman, that keep

world ' s beings ” (NPR), Graceland, At Last is a book full of gifts for Southerners and non-Southerners alike.

Being able to afford nutritionally complete food that provides energy and health, and continuing to have access to that food day after day after day, is a luxury that's missing from the lives of the 460,000 Central Texans who are classified as food insecure by the USDA. This project is an attempt to understand what the issues surrounding healthy food access in Austin are, and what the potential solutions might be. The three nonprofits that are profiled in this report - Urban Roots, Karpophore and Sprouting Healthy Kids - use education, community building, and advocacy to try to get closer to that goal of not only feeding Central Texans nutritious food, but changing the entire community's relationship with that food.

This capstone is a secondary research analysis of an integrated approach to spelling instruction. My students' frustration with spelling motivated me to research spelling instructional strategies. I knew there had to be a better technique out there, one that was productive for students. Rebecca Sitton, Donald Bear, and Kelly Loeffler offered approaches that I found to be intriguing. I attended conferences and purchased curriculum that supported their strategies. I implemented a combination of Sitton, Bear, and Loeffler's approaches to spelling instruction into my classroom and analyzed 26 sixth grade students spelling projects, weekly word lists, and literature notebooks. An

emphasis was placed on an increasing understanding of patterns and rules. Integrating these three strategies into the classroom has increased spelling achievement and helped create a balanced approach to teaching spelling in the middle school classroom.

On the heels of his historic election to the United States Senate, Raphael G. Warnock occupies a singular place in American life. Senator Warnock grew up in the Kayton Homes housing projects in Savannah, the eleventh of twelve children. After graduating from Morehouse College, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. ' s alma mater, Senator Warnock studied for a decade at Union Theological Seminary while serving at Harlem ' s Abyssinian Baptist Church. At thirty-five, he became the senior pastor at Ebenezer, where Dr. King had preached and served. In January 2021, Senator Warnock won a runoff election that flipped control of the Senate at one of the most pivotal moments in recent American history. He is the first Black senator from Georgia, only the eleventh Black senator in American history, and just the second Black senator from the South since Reconstruction. As he said in his maiden speech from the well of the senate, Senator Warnock ' s improbable journey reflects the ongoing toggle between the pain and promise of the American story. A powerful preacher and a leading voice for voting rights and democracy, Senator Warnock has a once-in-a-generation gift to inspire and lead us forward. In our digital world, data is power. Information hoarding businesses reign supreme, using intimidation, aggression, and force to maintain influence and control. Sarah Lamdan brings us into the unregulated underworld of these "data cartels", demonstrating how the entities mining, commodifying, and selling our data and informational resources perpetuate social inequalities and threaten the democratic sharing of knowledge. Just a few companies dominate most of our critical informational resources. Often self-identifying as "data analytics" or "business solutions" operations, they supply the digital lifeblood that flows through the circulatory system of the internet. With their control over data, they can prevent the free flow of information, masterfully exploiting outdated information and privacy laws and curating online information in a way that amplifies digital racism and targets marginalized communities. They can also

distribute private information to predatory entities. Alarmingly, everything they're doing is perfectly legal. In this book, Lamdan contends that privatization and tech exceptionalism have prevented us from creating effective legal regulation. This in turn has allowed oversized information oligopolies to coalesce. In addition to specific legal and market-based solutions, Lamdan calls for treating information like a public good and creating digital infrastructure that supports our democratic ideals.
